



Promise-Keeping God

Reflect + Discuss

- Share a photo that reminds you of a moment you would go back to if you could.
- Read Micah 7:8–20. What stands out to you from the text? What questions do you have?
- In verse 7:9, Micah presents God seated beside us in a courtroom as our defense, rather than as the judge/prosecutor. Does this fit with the way you usually think about God? Where do you usually imagine God seated in your courtroom?
- What has God promised? How is this different from what you wish God would promise?
- Read Micah 7:18–20. Reflect on the idea that God tosses our sin into the sea, making it gone forever. What does this tell us about who God is?
- How does remembering God's faithfulness in the past renew our hope for today? How have you been encouraged in your walk with God by stories of God's faithfulness to others? Share about a time in your life when you felt strongly that God was with you, or that He was working in your life.

Pray

- Reflect on a moment in your life when you experienced God's faithfulness. Out of this space of reflection, praise God for the ways He works in our lives, and that we can count on Him to keep His promises. Pray also for discernment to remember what God has promised compared to what we wish He would promise.

Next Steps

- Do you have a go-to piece of scripture that you turn to when you need to be reminded of God's faithfulness? Choose a piece of scripture to focus on this week – here are a couple ideas for how to engage with the verse(s) you choose:
 - Memorize the verse(s)
 - Take a walk while reading/listening to the verse(s)
 - Center your prayer around the verse(s)
 - Make some artwork inspired by the verse(s)
 - Journal about the verse(s) (ex. reflection on the verse, what it reveals about God, etc.)
