



**6/29/2025 | 2 Timothy**  
**Reflect + Discuss**

*Optional: It takes ~11 minutes to read the entire book of 2 Timothy. Consider as a group if you'd like to read the whole book before beginning discussion, OR you can jump right into the questions.*

- Have you ever had a close relationship with someone in a very different stage of life than you? What are some of the best parts of that relationship?
- Read 2 Timothy 1:1-5. Read 2 Timothy 2:1-2. Are there people who you intentionally pray for who are not family? What do these verses reveal to us about the importance of multi-generational relationships?
- Considering the call to 'pour into' others, who are you currently investing in spiritually or relationally? If no one immediately comes to mind, what might be a practical first step to intentionally seek out someone to mentor or encourage in their faith journey? How can engaging with people of different ages enrich your own walk with God?
- On the flipside, can you think of anyone who has significantly invested in your life, whether in the past or present? How has their wisdom, guidance, or presence impacted your faith and personal growth?
- Read 2 Timothy 4:1-8. Regardless of your current season of life – whether you feel like you're in the 'first half' or the 'second half' of life– what does it look like for you to 'fight the good fight' as you strive to follow Jesus faithfully? Is there an area in your life where you need to keep putting one foot in front of the other, trusting God will carry you through?
- Are there any next steps you sense God is calling you towards as we think about multigenerational relationships? What might it look like to cultivate or deepen these types of relationships in your own life and in our church community? (Note: Reminder about serving with BKids as a GREAT way to meet others and serve with the younger generation)

### **Pray**

Pray that we would be motivated to run our race well. Pray that we would grow in understanding God's multi-generational vision for the church and that we may sense the Holy Spirit in our own lives as we consider who to invest in. As we continue to reflect on this message, pray that we will grow in our own desire to finish well.
