Exodus 3:14 (NIV)

¹⁴ God said to Moses, “I AM WHO I AM. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: ‘I AM (*’ehyê*) has sent me to you.’” ¹⁵ God also said to Moses, “Say to the Israelites, ‘The LORD (*Yahweh*), the God of your fathers—the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob—has sent me to you.’”

² Pharaoh said, “Who is the LORD (Yahweh), that I should obey him and let Israel go? I do not know the LORD (Yahweh) and I will not let Israel go.”

The Pattern of the First Nine Plagues

- Moses and Aaron confront the Pharaoh and warn him about the plague.
- God commands Moses to initiate the plague.
- Pharaoh summons Moses and ask for the plague to be removed, promising to let the people go.
- Moses prays and God removes the plague.
- God or Pharaoh hardens his heart, and he refuses to let the people go.

7:5 And the Egyptians will know that I am the LORD

7:17 By this you will know that I am the LORD

8:10 so that you may know there is no one like the LORD our God.

8:22b so that you will know that I, the LORD, am in this land.




