


¹⁴ Then the LORD **relented** and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.




²¹ He said to Aaron, “What did these people do to you, that you led them into such great sin?”




³³ The LORD replied to Moses, “Whoever has sinned against me I will blot out of my book.

The problem isn't that God can't forgive his people. It's that His people can't keep the covenant.




Seeing miracles doesn't lead to a transformed




Moses went up the mountain to try and fix the
