



7/26/2026 | Getting it Right Reflect + Discuss

- What has been your experience or exposure to gifts like tongues or prophecy (i.e., experienced, curious, unsure, or brand new to it)?
- Read 1 Corinthians 14:1-4. Read 1 Corinthians 13:1. What do these verses reveal about the primary purpose of spiritual gifts? Why is it so important to have love?
- Paul emphasizes in 1 Corinthians 14 that church worship should help outsiders understand and engage with what is happening. Where do you see Blackhawk doing this well on Sunday mornings? How can you personally help make others feel more at home?
- Where are you currently on your spiritual gift journey: 1) Trying to discover what my gifts are, or 2) Trying to grow in and use a gift I already recognize.
As you consider your own journey, what might a next step be for you to grow in this area? Is there anything preventing you from believing that the Holy Spirit has a gift for you?
- If you know your gift, are there any factors preventing you from growing or using it (i.e. fear, lack of opportunity, uncertainty, lack of time)? What are some practical steps you can take to overcome them?
- Pastor Charles encouraged us to be careful and remember:
 - *Spiritual gifts don't define spirituality.*
 - *We celebrate rather than compare spiritual gifts.*
 - *Spiritual gifts are given for the good of the body, not for personal recognition.*
 Which of these reminders challenged or encouraged you the most? How can we guard against pride, comparison, or self-centeredness when it comes to spiritual gifts?
- Pastor Charles highlighted the tension between serving according to our passion/gifting, and serving according to the needs of the church. Which emphasis do you sense God inviting you to focus more on in this season?
- What questions do you still have about spiritual gifts? Are there ways this group can support one another as we continue on our spiritual journey?

Pray

Pray that we would be expectant in receiving and growing in the gifts of the Spirit. Pray that we would be careful to measure our spirituality not by our gifts but by our love, to celebrate the gifts of others, and to focus on using our gifts to build up the body of Christ. As we continue to reflect on this message, pray that we would deepen our gratitude for the privilege of being invited to partner with God through the gifts He has entrusted to us, and that we would respond with faithful obedience and joyful responsibility.
