- Read Genesis 1:27. What is the significance of being made in God's image? How does this differ from the cultural message, 'I am what I produce'? How might leaning on A.I. diminish our ability to discern?
- Read Proverbs 27:5-6. Read Proverbs 28:23. How is "friendship" with an A.I. bot different from real friendship according to the Bible? What might be appealing to someone about talking to a "bot"? What are the dangers of looking to an A.I. bot for friendship rather than human beings?
- Read Colossians 1:15-18. Why is it important to remember that A.I. is a created reality under Christ's supremacy? As technology grows more capable, how can we ensure that God—rather than data, convenience, or algorithms—remains the ultimate authority in our decision-making and lives?
- Pastor Chris said, "A.I. in and of itself is not bad, but what it's doing is it is accelerating current cultural trends in our world today that lead us away from becoming the kind of people God wants us to be."

What is one key insight you gained from this message? What is one practical step or boundary you might set this week regarding technology and A.I. in light of what we discussed?
