Reflect + Discussion

- Are you naturally good at making decisions, or do you tend to be indecisive?
- Pastor Lynne described God's will as being less about where you will go and what you will do and more about who you are *becoming*. What is the difference between those two ways of thinking?
- Read Romans 12:1-2 Pastor Lynne stated: *"Discernment doesn't lead to transformation. Transformation leads to discernment."* How does asking *"Who is God forming me to become?"* change how we make choices compared to asking *"What is the right choice?"*
- Read Galatians 5:22-23. What traits of Jesus are we called to cultivate? How does becoming more like Jesus lead to better decisions?
- Read Proverbs 3:5-6. The Hebrew word for "acknowledge/submit" (*yāda*) means *to know*. How does reading this verse as *"in all your ways **know** Him"* change how you approach everyday choices?
- We often carry guilt or second-guess past choices. Looking at figures like Abraham and Peter, how does knowing God can redeem our imperfect decisions bring freedom and relief?
- When we have to make a decision, Lynne suggested four helpful steps:
 - o Evaluate how the option lines up with what God says.
 - o Get input from wise, godly people.
 - o Consider what experts or experience would say.
 - o Make a decision in faith.

Is there a decision you're facing where you need to seek scripture, wise counsel, expertise, or simply take a step of faith? How can this group support you as you navigate that a decision?

Pray

Pray that we may grow closer to God through the process of making decisions. Pray that as we walk with Him, our desire to do what God wants would increase. Pray that as we navigate real decisions in our lives today, that we will lean on God every step of the way. As we continue to reflect on this message, pray that we would continue to be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit.
